

Jesus' home	KS1	No. of lessons: up to one term
<p>Learning objectives: To begin to imagine what life was like at the time of Jesus, and to understand Jesus as a real person in history. To hear and engage with some of the stories of, and about, Jesus.</p>		
<p>Questions for reflection: Who is important to me? What can we learn from stories about what to say and what to do? Was Jesus just like me when he was a child? Why did people follow Jesus? What is my favourite story about Jesus and why?</p>		
<p>Activities and experiences:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ◆ Create Jesus' home in the home corner (see following page for ideas on what to include) ◆ Use the items in the home corner as a focus for telling stories about Jesus, leading off if possible with the book "If I had lived in Jesus time". The photographs on the website below can also be used as a story telling stimulus ◆ Try out some recipes and/or create craft objects which can be connected with Jesus – always link these with stories to maintain the context. ◆ Create a class storybook of photographs of pupils working with the home corner and their retellings of the stories they have heard about Jesus. You may like to invite someone from the local church to come and be shown the home corner, and be invited to share their own favourite story about Jesus.
