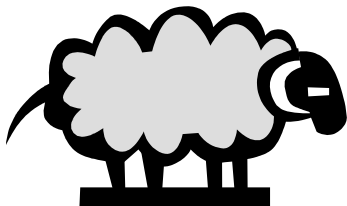

Make Lambs Tail Biscuits for Mothering Sunday

Use a conventional refrigerator biscuit recipe and find a playdoh cutter in the shape of a sheep so that the children stamp out sheep shapes.

Once the biscuits are cool, allow the children to use white icing in a piping bag to pipe squiggles on the sheep for wool.

Once these have dried, wrap in green table napkins to take home.



Recipe card for Drop Scones

100g self raising flour
pinch of salt
1 tablespoon castor sugar
1 egg
150 ml milk
white fat for cooking
heavy based frying pan or griddle, large bowl
palette knife, ladle, whisk
clean tea towel or kitchen roll



Set pan on hot plate and heat up whilst making batter. Sift flour and salt into bowl and stir in sugar. Make a well in the middle of the flour and add egg. Add milk a little at a time, whisking lightly together until a smooth batter is obtained. Drop small amount white fat on to pan and coat base. Use ladle to drop small amount of batter in about 5 places and allow drop scones to cook until the surface bubbles. Turn over and briefly cook other side. Use knife to transfer scones on to clean tea towel or kitchen paper and fold over to keep scones warm. Serve with butter or sugar and lemon juice. Recipe makes about 18 scones.
