Bishop's Lent Appeal 2011 funding Bibles for China

For the Bishop's Lent Appeal 2011, parishes are invited to support the Bible Society's China Project.

The China Project provides several million Bibles a year to Chinese Christians, many of them new to the faith, at affordable prices. It is approved by the state of China and the China Christian Council. £350 will purchase a roll of paper sufficient to print 600 Bibles. £30 will buy 50 Bibles. 60p will cover the cost of the paper used for a single edition. The quality of the finished article, printed on fine paper and in a simulated leather binding, is impressive and reinforces the significance of what is being given.

Bishop Stephen says *'The Bible Society and its affiliates are an enormous organisation, extending across the world, and best known*

for offering the Bible to people who might never otherwise have the opportunity to read it in their own language. Their work is a particularly appropriate focus for giving in the year when we celebrate the 400th anniversary of the King James Bible and its enormous influence on the English-speaking world.'

The King's Speech

In December 2009, at a time when any Cathedral is gearing up for one of its busiest times of the year, we found ourselves preparing to be one of the key locations for The King's Speech.

A week of major stage building, props and set dressing transformed the Octagon area into the interior of Westminster Abbey, just as it looked in 1937 on the eve of the Coronation of King George VI.

Shopping - another new religion?

The Ven Hugh McCurdy, Archdeacon of Huntingdon and Wisbech, was recently contacted by Hodder Education for permission to use a letter he had written in 1998 as a parish priest. It had been found online on the Histon and Impington Village website.

His article was an open letter to the local community on the subject of shopping and religion. In it, he remarked how shopping had become a leisure activity in recent years. The day, exploring the theological, missional, ministerial and practical implications of this relatively unvisited topic, is on Thursday 26th May, 10.30am - 4pm at Bishop Woodford House, Ely. Emma's writing and research explores the interface of mothering and ministry and how that dialogue can inform and enrich our self-understanding and ministerial practice.

This conference is not just for women clergy/ministers with children but for anyone - male and female, married and single - who wants to think about the impact of this theme in the Church and wider society.

Hodder Education are using the article in their publication '*Religious Studies for Common Entrance Teacher's Resource Book*' by Susan Grenfell. Hugh's letter is to appear on a worksheet for pupils in a unit on *Elijah and the prophets of Baal* with accompanying questions such as 'In what ways are supermarkets like and unlike churches?' and 'What is meant by the phrase "modern temples"?'.

Hugh says '*I was delighted that my letter to parishioners from so long ago is going to be used in this way. It is also a reminder of how enduring anything we write on the Internet can be.*'
