Farewell to the Diocesan Secretary

Dr Matthew Lavis joined the Diocese as Diocesan Secretary in the mid 1990s. The rôle entails being responsible for all the diocesan finances. The Diocesan Secretary is a member of the Bishop's Senior Staff, liaising with them about all policy issues. He is also responsible for the Diocesan Synod, the Bishop's Council and the Diocesan Board of Finance.

Dr Lavis spoke on behalf of the Diocese, "Dr Lavis has been a great Diocesan Secretary - someone who has served the Diocese well for the last 15 years. Over those years the financial pressure has been immense, pension contributions have increased, cost of ministry has likewise increased but we are in a good financial position largely thanks to Matthew's prudent management and forward thinking leadership.

New projects have been completed including the Woodland Burial site at Barton and Cambridge Church. Matthew has played a significant role in both those projects as well as the new church at Hampton. We are grateful for his wise, perceptive and dedicated ministry among us and wish him well in retirement."

Bid for new Church of England school successful

The Diocese has won the opportunity to establish a new school near Peterborough. The primary school, which will be called St Michael's, is to be a Church of England Voluntary Aided school. It will serve a newly built development called 'Cardea', south of Stanground where there are plans for more than 1500 homes.

Director of Education, Canon Tim Elbourne said, "This will be an inclusive neighbourhood

school with a clear Christian ethos. Schools are at the heart of their communities, and the Church now has the chance serve this new development from its beginning."

It will initially be built for up to 210 pupils to open in September 2012.

The Diocese currently provides 82 schools serving over 13,500 pupils. St Michael's will be the fifth new school it has established over the last decade.

Uganda Projects update

Following their walk from Ely to Norwich in the spring to raise money for The Bishop's School in south-west Uganda, Canon Richard Darmody, his wife June and six others visited Uganda in the summer.

On the first Sunday some of the party attended a Confirmation Service. In an event lasting 5 hours, the Bishop confirmed 140 people with a congregation of around one thousand people.

Richard and June, together with the Revd Gita Bond, spoke at Convention meetings which entailed a lot of travelling on bumpy mountain

roads. One of the other speakers was a Ugandan evangelist named Canon Wilson, aged 93!

Others in the group visited a model farm where some of the money they'd raised was being used to purchase pedigree goats to establish a milking herd. This in turn will provide kids to start herds in the villages.
