IMAGINING THE FUTURE: A CONVERSATION TOGETHER



I have now been your Bishop for almost a year. As you will know, I have been spending much of my time visiting clergy in their homes and getting round each deanery. I have also visited a significant number of our schools. I have been listening carefully and reflecting upon what I have heard. I do not claim that I yet know the Diocese intimately; but I have been learning fast and working to build relationships of mutual affection and trust. At the same time, in sermons, talks and video presentations I have been seeking a conversation with you about what a rich future might look like. I have written a document which will be coming out for discussion across the Diocese during Lent and Eastertide. Bishop David will be engaging in six short pilgrimages in Lent to frame the conversation.

Other members of the Bishop's Staff will be meeting people in other ways and I shall be meeting groups, too.

Imagining the Future is not a strategy document. It is describing what I see about us now and a vision of what we might become together. I have said repeatedly already that the Kingdom of God is growing in our midst. We have confidence in the God who transforms lives and brings hope and acceptance to individuals and communities.

Strategies and policies will follow from our vision of

God. God is in charge. So much of what we hope for is not set by structures or a long string of initiatives, but by culture and tone.

We turn to Christ to get a life as adventurous disciples. I have been talking about our life together being framed by prayer and parties. Everything is rooted in our growing into the character of Christ, being cross-shaped people who have a joyful and playful trust in the risen life of Christ. Now is the time to reclaim the rich fullness of our faith by putting down deeper roots in prayer, study and celebration so that we can all hear the call of the Christ who comes to us, stays with us and sends us.

When I share the cure of souls with the clergy, this is not primarily about hierarchically delegated responsibility, but about the distribution of authority around and among those called to exercise it for the sake of God's mission.

Therefore it is all our calling is to find out what God is doing in our midst and then to join in. We are confident in the fullness of God's power and the abundance of His mercy as we embrace the challenges of being a growing diocese.

The paper and supporting questions to prompt discussion will follow soon. It is an invitation to join in and imagine the future together.

David Evans, Rector of Hilgay with Ten Mile Bank and Southery

We were all saddened to learn of the death of the Revd Canon David Evans who died at his home on 3 January 2012 after being diagnosed with cancer last October.

Canon Evans had served in Ely Diocese since 1990 having previously been Rector of Somersham, Pidley and Old Hurst, and acting Priest-in-Charge of Wretton with Stoke Ferry and Whittington. He was ordained and served in Southwark Diocese prior to his move to Ely. He

was licensed as Rural Dean of Fincham and Feltwell Deanery in 2009 and was installed as an honorary Canon of the Cathedral in December 2011.

David was a devoted and much loved parish priest. He is survived by his wife Jean and their three children Ian, Daniel and Heloise.

His funeral was held at All Saints Church, Hilgay on 18 January 2012

Six mini-pilgrimages for Lent with Bishop David

Bishop David invites you to join him on one of six mini-pilgrimages this Lent, to walk, talk and listen to one another, God and God's world around us, and to let our hearts be warmed as they were for the first disciples on the Emmaus Road.

Each day will begin with a short service using a meditation from Bishop David's *Listening in Lent* booklet.* We will then walk to a second church, talking as we go about how we *Imagine The Future*, in response to Bishop Stephen's paper

After a second service and talk we will set off for a third church, lunch and a third service, before our third walk and a final service and talk (sometimes ending back in the first church, sometimes close by, sometimes with a lift back to it). The three walks will be under an hour long each and on as firm a terrain as we can manage. Please bring your own food: drinks will be provided. All the days will begin at 10am and finish around 4pm. You are welcome to join in part of the day if that is all you can manage, and/or to use cars if you need to. Dates are listed under What's On?.
