# Foreword of the Commission of the speciment

Your Graces

It is clear from the use which has been made of Holy Communion: Series 2 both at home and abroad during the past four years that the rite has served a useful purpose. It has been a valuable means of experiment at home, while its influence on the new rites of other Churches has been far from negligible. Nevertheless, it was never intended to be a finished product; and experience has revealed its limitations. We believed that it was simply a step in the right direction. That belief has been justified: for we have been able to build Series 3 on the foundations of Series 2; and although there are all kinds of changes in language and detail, we have found no solid reason to make any serious departure from the basic structure of our original rite. It is a matter of great pleasure to us to be able to present a unanimous Report. We have succeeded in overcoming the problems which divided us in 1966, and here we must express our deep gratitude to those many people who have helped us and in particular to our friends of the Doctrine Commission. We hope that the Church of England will find in this rite a further significant step towards the creation of a new and worthy Book of Common Prayer in the not too distant future.

### Notes

- 1 Posture. Wherever a certain posture is particularly appropriate, it is indicated in the left-hand margin. At all other points local custom may be established and followed.
- 2 Saying and singing. Where rubrics indicate that a section is to be 'said', this must be understood to include 'or sung' and vice versa.
- 3 Seasonal material. The proper thanksgivings (28) are obligatory; but the seasonal sentences (1, 37) and the seasonal blessings (44) are optional. The use of one portion of the optional material does not necessitate the use of the other portions.
- 4 Series 2 material. During the initial period of experiment, it is permitted to use in certain sections the texts prescribed in Holy Communion Series 2 instead of the texts printed here. These sections are: the Salutation (3), the Collect for Purity (4), the Gloria in Excelsis (5), the responses to the Gospel (11), the Nicene Creed (13), the Prayers (15), the Comfortable Words (17), the Confession (18), the Prayer of Humble Access (20), the Lord's Prayer (31), the Anthems (34), and the final prayer after communion (39). Where parts of the service are also sung to well-known musical settings, it is also permitted to use the words for which these settings were composed.
- 5 The Kyries (5). The Kyries may be said or sung in English or Greek. In penitential seasons it is desirable

- that this section should be used in preference to Gloria in Excelsis.
- 6 The Gloria in Excelsis (5). This canticle is also appropriate at sections 2, 10, or 40.
- 7 The Collects (6). The Collects are either those appointed in the Book of Common Prayer or those appended to Holy Communion Series 1.
- 8 The Lessons (7,9,11). The Lessons should be announced in the order: book, chapter, verse. They should be either those set out in Tables 1—3 appended to Holy Communion Series 3, or those in the Book of Common Prayer, or any other lessons which are authorized for use in the Church of England. When the lessons of Table 1 appended to Series 3 are used and only two lessons are read, the Epistle should be omitted during Advent and the last five weeks of Trinity; the Old Testament lesson should be omitted during the rest of Trinity and Whitsun; and either the Old Testament lesson or the Epistle may be omitted from Christmas until the end of Easter.
- 9 The Sermon (12). A sermon should be preached at (12) whenever possible; but it is not necessary at every service.
- 10 The Prayers (15). The introduction to the specific subjects of prayer is not restricted to the printed forms 'we give thanks for', 'we pray for', 'we commemorate'. Other forms may be used at the discretion of the minister provided they are clearly addressed to God.

- 11 The Peace (22). The president may accompany the words of the Peace with a handclasp or similar action: and both the words and the action may be passed through the congregation.
- 12 The Thanksgiving (26-29). During the Thanksgiving the president may be joined by any other priests who are present.
- 13 A Service without Communion. When there is to be no communion, the minister reads the service as far as the absolution (19) and then adds the Lord's Prayer (31), the General Thanksgiving, and other prayers at his discretion, ending with the Grace. When such a service is led by a deacon or lay person, 'us' is said instead of 'you' in the Absolution (19).
- 14 Hymns. Various points are indicated for the singing of hymns; but if occasion requires they may be sung at other points also.

# **Appendix**

### Tables of Psalms and Lessons

The psalms and lessons in these tables following are to be used at Holy Communion in accordance with the Rules to Order the Service.\* The numbering of the verses of the psalms is according to the Revised Psalter. A different numbering in the Prayer Book version is indicated in square brackets. Other references to passages of scripture are to the Revised Standard Version; but any version of holy scripture may be used which is permitted by lawful authority.

### Table 1

The psalms and lessons in this table are appointed for use on Sundays and certain other days, and may also be used on the weekdays which follow.

They may also be used at Morning and Evening Prayer on their appointed days. At Holy Communion on weekdays the lessons of the Alternative Lectionary (1970) may also be used, in such a way that when the lessons for one year are read at Morning and Evening Prayer, the lessons for the alternate year are read at Holy Communion.

Note that the lessons for the five Sundays before Advent Sunday shall always be those provided for Trinity 23 and the four weeks following. Lessons for Trinity 18 to Trinity 22 will be used according as they are needed.
